Seventeen musicians, 12 bands and 9 dancers took home \$7,450 in contest prize money during the 25th anniversary of the Appalachian String Band Music Festival at Camp Washington-Carver in Clifftop, Fayette County, from July 30 - Aug. 3. Seven of the winners are from West Virginia.

More than 2,300 musicians, dancers, fans and friends attended the West Virginia Division of Culture and History's five-day event that features some of the nation's finest string band musicians and flat-foot dancers.
