



Hills. A ballustraded terrace wraps around two sides of the house. The doric portico, added in the twenties, lends a colonial revival air to the structure. The hipped platform roof has deep overhaging eaves, a gabled front dormer and shed dormers on the sides.

Andrew Calderwood, who was the builder of the house, was well respected in Charleston for his fine construction of the old West Virginia State House, the Roman Catholic Churchand the Ruffner Hotel.

"Home Hill" is situated on a two (2) acre rectangle approximatly 400' by 400' bounded on the north by Holley Road and on the south by a contour line.
