7 DESCRIPTION

The Levi Shinn House, near Shinnston, Harrison County, West Virginia, was built by its owner in 1778. Its structure was typical of log buildings of the place and period in some respects, atypical in others. It was constructed of native hardwood logs, these squared by hand tools, notched at the corners, and erected in tiers. It was of two stories in height, with the gabled roof providing a storage attic. Logs were chinked with clay. Since the main body of the house is preserved in its original condition, the tool marks on the logs may still be seen.

One feature of the house which was not typical of the frontier in the 18th century was the large interior chimney, providing fireplaces for several of the cabin's rooms. Fireplaces are still much as they were.

So far as can be determined, the original roofing material was clapboard "shakes," rived out of blocks of white oak. The original roof has long been replaced by more modern materials.

Later owners of the property added a small front porch to the house, placed siding boards on the gable ends, and added a kitchen at the rear. In the main structure, however, many of the original rafters, beams, and other materials are in palce. The structure preserves much of the exterior and interior integrity of a typical 18th century settler's cabin.

The original log house had a length of 37 feet, and a width of 20 feet, 8 inches. It contained four rooms, with a four-foot hallway, and a staircase at the north end leading to the second floor. There was also a rudely constructed cellar, reached by an interior stairway.

Levi Shinn was the founder and first settler of the community of Shinnston, in what is now northern Harrison County, West Virginia. He was born in 1748, near Burlington, New Jersey, and in 1772 he and a younger brother moved to the valley of the West Fork of Monongahela River, in the colony of Virginia. Here he and his brother acquired lands, but they returned to New Jersey until 1778, when Levi came once again to the Shinnston area, and there built the log house which stands today.

Shinn was of the Quaker faith, and he used his influence to encourage local settlers to ramain on their lands and tend their crops even during the troubled times of Indian wars and the Revolution. His religion prevented his bearing arms during the Revolutionary War, but he was a supporter of the new nation in the years of its formation.

He became an extensive property owner in Harrison County, and near his home he established what may have been the first grist mill in the county. This structure, along with settlers' cabins that grew up around it, became the nucleus for the present village of Shinnston.

Levi Shinn led the quiet life of a pioneer; he did not seek public office, nor did he covet honors and fame. His major interests were in the development and preservation of his properties, which he passed on to his children. The present log structure remained in family hands for several generations. It is believed by local historians to be the oldest standing home in the county.

In 1972 the active Shinnston Historical Association acquired the Levi Shinn House for the purposes of preserving it as an historical landmark, and of using it as headquarters for their activities.
