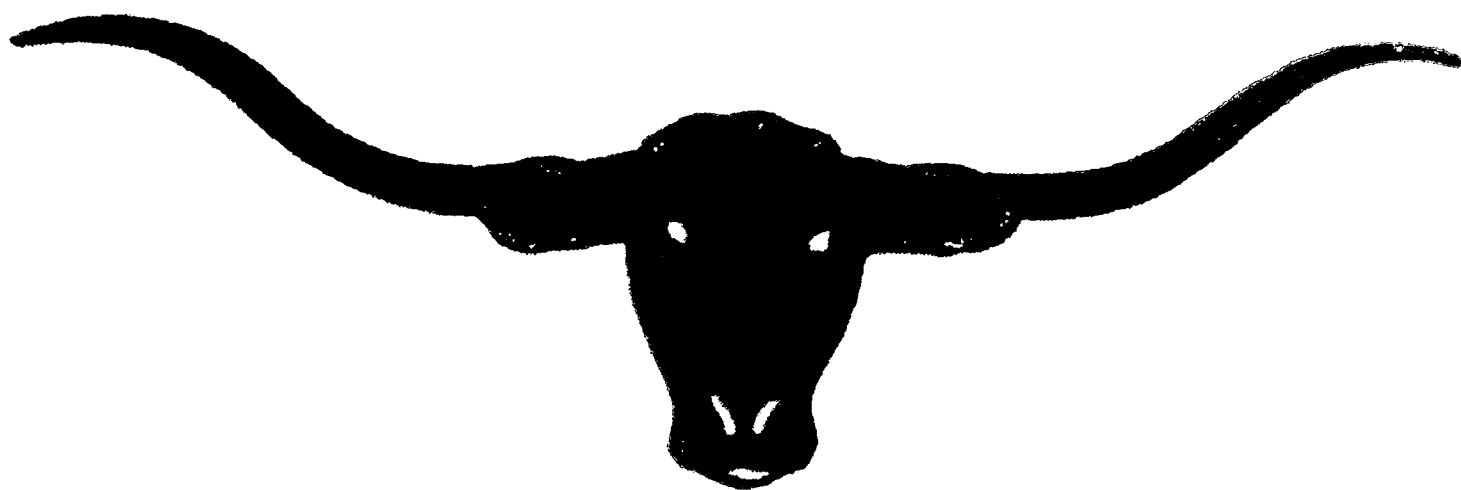

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PREFACE

The Agricultural Historic Resource Survey of Harrison County, West Virginia is a continuation of the Harrison County Historic Landmarks Commission's (HLC) commitment to identify and document the architectural, agricultural and historical resources located in Harrison County, West Virginia. This survey represents Phase I of the process and will be akin to a Reconnaissance Survey. This report and survey will be used to guide the HLC on where to concentrate efforts in future work.

A grant from the West Virginia Division of Culture and History, State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO), was awarded in the Spring of 2002 to the Harrison County Historic Landmarks Commission to do an Agricultural Historic Resource Survey of Harrison County, West Virginia. The HLC had identified farms in the county through research in the county records and the HLC and the Consultant agreed upon the initial focus of the survey within the county. The area surveyed was to encompass three hundred (300) resources in addition to any and all outbuildings associated with each primary structure.

The survey area was to include specific farms in Harrison County as previously identified by the HLC. The survey area encompasses approximately 418 square miles.

The area surveyed yielded one hundred and fifty (150) primary resources. This count does not include modern resources. The contract called for the recordation of three hundred (300) resources but due to time constraints and the vast area included in the survey, the consultant was only able to document one hundred and fifty (150) primary resources.

USGS topographic maps and county maps were used for the field work and initial field notes were prepared. It was agreed by all that the focus of the survey would be agricultural properties.

The consultant team would like to acknowledge the willing cooperation he received from the property owners in the survey area, particularly Mr. Jim Freeman, Mr. Robert Suan, Ms. Cheryl Cornwell, and Mr. and Mrs. David Douglas and their son, David. Property owners were helpful, friendly and knowledgeable about their homes and the area's history.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the survey was to investigate the extant historic built environment of agricultural properties of Harrison County, West Virginia and determine the extent of remaining historic resources. These were then to be evaluated based on the National Register Criteria for Evaluation to determine the significance and historical context of each of the resources. From this, decisions as to National Register eligibility could be made. It was expected that due to the closeness of the Clarksburg-Bridgeport area, that some of the resources would have been modified to the point of having lost integrity. Modifications were found but not as many as expected. It was also expected that many modern resources would be found. This was not the case. The majority of the areas surveyed retained their rural landscape. The HLC's goal is to incorporate the protection and interpretation of the historic built environment into its overall plan.

The HLC wishes to identify the resources in the area and include them in its and the County's planning procedures. An understanding of the amount, concentration and quality of resources is needed for this purpose. The project was intended to identify and preliminarily quantify resources in Harrison County, West Virginia and assist in making decisions for future activities, including National Register of Historic Places nominations for individual structures or historic districts.

METHODOLOGY

The first step in the process was to gather and review the archival and other research on the specific farms selected by the HLC through their county records search. The Harrison County Historic Landmarks Commission provided the consultant team with property owners names and addresses and dates of buildings.

The base maps used for the survey were the USGS topographic maps for the specific areas of the county surveyed. These maps and county highway maps were provided by the HLC with the farm sites marked per assessor's office information. This gave the consultant a good snapshot of modern and historic structures. Modern structures were not noted in the survey as the majority of the area is rural.

It should be noted that the consultant team considered this survey a Reconnaissance Survey only. The number of sites to be recorded and the area surveyed was very ambitious within the time period granted. This survey will be a snapshot of agricultural properties within the specific geographic areas noted on the USGS topographic maps.

The consultant team drove to specific areas as previously identified by the HLC and surveyed those properties. It became very clear within a day of field work that this method was impractical due to the inaccuracies of records versus on-site identification. A meeting was held on the first day with the consultant team and the HLC to determine an alternative method. It was agreed upon by both parties that the consultant team would focus on specific areas of the county but not specific properties. It was also agreed that the focus would be on identifying agricultural properties.

The consultant again drove to a specific geographic area of the county and began identifying agricultural properties. A field log of all properties identified as or observed to be pre-1955 was compiled. This included a field number for each of these resources and a brief description of the property and any outbuildings. This log served as the basis for the documentation of these sites on West Virginia Historic Property inventory forms. Also included was an initial determination if the property contained historic or architectural qualities warranting listing on the National Register of Historic Places, either individually or as contributing to a historic district. In all, one hundred and fifty (150) resources were logged in. This includes 710 resources when primary and secondary resources are counted. Included in this count is one bridge, site #065E, the 1918 "Davis" concrete bridge. One hundred and fifty (150) individual resources were recorded on West Virginia Historic Property inventory forms.

The background research material provided by all parties was correlated with the field notes and subsequent on-site follow up to provide an architectural and historic time line of the areas.

Following these phases, with the maps and the field notes, the consultant team again drove the survey area. For properties previously identified, or in the opinion of the surveyor, as pre-1955, a photograph was taken, black and white, and information confirmed on the description, architectural style, modifications, etc. for documentation on inventory forms. Numbers were added to the map, corresponding to the field notes. Properties that had lost integrity through modifications or additions were noted as not eligible but were still documented on the West Virginia Historic Property inventory form.

For analysis and recommendations purposes, several classifications were used: contributing to an eligible historic district (CHD); individually eligible to the National Register of Historic Places (CE); not eligible due to modifications or deterioration (CE); and already listed on the National Register of Historic Places (NR). These classifications allowed the consultant team to place the resource within an architectural or historical context and for a broader view of the entire survey area.

Additional slides were also taken of the resources in the survey area.

Current owners information and historical information for the inventory forms was derived from research done by the Harrison County HLC and individual property owners. Any and all pertinent information was also compiled from current property owner interviews during this survey; on-site and via telephone and email.

The field and research information was transferred to the West Virginia Historic Property inventory forms and they were prepared for final typing. One hundred and fifty (150) West Virginia Historic Property inventory forms were completed for the Harrison County Agricultural Historic Resource Survey.

At this point, the survey team also evaluated the resources to determine the significance of the resources. Evaluation was conducted following the National Register of Historic Places Criteria for Evaluation and the classifications noted earlier were used in the analysis section of this report.

Site numbers were recorded on the survey map and this numbering system is consistent for the report, inventory forms, maps and photographs. The topographic maps used in this survey are under separate cover. Individual UTM references for each site are noted on the inventory form and in the UTM reference log in this report.

The report was then compiled to provide a reference and analysis of the survey activities and to provide direction for future activities by the Harrison County Historic Landmarks Commission.

OUTLINE HISTORY OF THE SURVEY AREAS LOCATED IN HARRISON COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA

The following is a brief historical synopsis of the areas surveyed within Harrison County, West Virginia. Several in-depth histories of Harrison County and the towns within it have already been written and it is redundant to reiterate these. These histories were utilized in this summary. See the Bibliography.

Harrison County, located in the north central part of West Virginia, was formed in 1784. It was named after Benjamin Harrison, father of William Henry Harrison, ninth U.S. president. One of the first white settlers in Harrison County was a trapper, John Simpson, who arrived in 1764. By 1771 other settlers had arrived. In 1773, David Davisson took claim to 400 acres of land which is now the central business district of Clarksburg, the county seat. Clarksburg was named in honor of George Rogers Clark in 1781. Harrison County was known in the past and continues to be known for its livestock and agricultural industry.

The first area surveyed in this project was the Wallace area. It is in the northwest corner of Harrison County. It includes Wallace itself, Middle Run, Big Elk Creek Road, Little Elk Creek Road, Harris Fork, the small town of Margaret and Dola and portions of State Route 20.

The small town of Wallace was named for Sir William Wallace. He was a Scottish hero who fought for Scotland's freedom from England. The first post office was established in 1849 and by 1875, Wallace had two residences, one store, a scale house and a blacksmith shop. Wesley Robinson operated the post office out of his general store. The first oil and gas hole was drilled in 1899 and the population by 1900 was 248. By 1910, it had grown to 375 persons to accommodate the oil and gas development. The town also had two doctors and a dentist. By 1916 there was a mill and a short line railroad. The population boomed by 1921 to 808. The chief industries were oil and gas development and agriculture. Common family names in the area were Robinson, Coffman, Garrett, Dye, Carson and Orr.

Dola was first settled in 1796 by Abraham Bennett. It was named for Dola Bell Rogers in approximately 1888 when the first post office was established. The primary industry was and is agriculture although other industries were established. The first railroad ran through town ca. 1903, some commercial coal mines were established ca. 1900, and the first paved roads were built in 1924. Dola had a population of 150 in 1976.

In the north central portion of the county, the area around Wyatt and Peora was surveyed. This includes the towns of Wyatt, Oakdale, and Peora, and farms on Cunningham Run Road, Bingamon Creek Road, Big Indian Run Road, and Little Indian Run Road.

Bingamon Creek was named for famed Indian fighter, Samuel Bingamon. He is reputed to have fought a band of Indians on the Jeremiah Hess farm (located on a hill behind the Wyatt School) and reportedly killed all of them. The first wooden bridge was built over the creek in 1891.

The small town of Wyatt was settled in 1865 by Eli Sharp. It was originally known as "Goosetown" for the geese Sharp raised. The town was renamed in 1873 in honor of Dr. Z.W. Wyatt who brought the town through a diphtheria epidemic. Wyatt became a boom town from 1917 through 1928 when Consolidated Coal Company's mine was in operation. During this time period, Wyatt was a farming community with a grist mill and two steam saw mills. The grist mill was demolished in 1917 to make way for the Western Maryland Railroad line. The brick school building, still exant, was built in 1919.

The small town of Peora was first settled ca. 1781 by Thomas and Edward Cunningham. They settled on Cunningham Run Road and were of Scotch-Irish descent. The Peora school was one of the first schools established through the free school system, and others were at Middle Run and Pleasant Dale. In 1910 the Hope Gas Company was formed in response to the oil and gas development in the area. The Western Maryland Railroad began construction in the area in 1916 and in 1920 coal mines started production in the area. The first hard surfaced road was built to Shinnston in 1924 and by 1929 rural electric lines were under construction. Common early family names in the area include Richardson, Baker, Ashcraft, Coffman, Hess, Cunningham, Moore, Ogden, Mason, Carpenter, and Miller.

Some of the areas around Romines Mills and Lost Creek were also surveyed. This area is located in the southeast portion of Harrison County. This includes the small town of Johnstown and Rockford. It also includes Lost Creek Road, Stevens Run Road, Hastings Run Road, Johnstown Road, Raccoon Run Road, Jake Run Road, Rockford Drive, Blue Lick Road, and Rooting Creek Road.

Romines Mills is located on State Route 20 between Buckhannon and Quiet Dell. It was named for Captain John D. Romine who was born in 1825 and resided on a farm of 75 acres near Rockford four miles away.

The town of Lost Creek was not incorporated until 1946. It was, however, settled prior to 1800 evidenced by the fact that Levi H. Bond had a grist mill on the banks of Lost Creek on property owned by Alton Bell before 1800. There is also a large brick residence in Lost Creek that was built ca. 1860 by Daniel Bassell.

Lost Creek became known as a leading cattle shipping center to the eastern market in Baltimore, north to Pittsburgh and west to Chicago. It was a branch line of the B&O and in 1923 Lost Creek was the largest cattle shipping point along the entire B&O line. Long horn steers were introduced to the area in the 1920's. There was a severe drought in Texas and Oklahoma in the 1920's and to help ease the strain on the ranchers there, several cattle car loads of long horns were shipped to farmers in Lost Creek. Not all of the cattle survived but those that did thrived and long horns can still be found in the area.

Coal mining began production ca. 1910 and eventually became the major shipping product.

From the town of Johnstown south to the mouth of Rooting Creek is a historic farm area. There are several properties there that have remained in the same families for 150-200 years or more and remain historically intact. Historic family names include the McPherson, Post, Queen, Lewis, and Davis.

According to local lore, Rooting Creek got its name from the large number of wild boars that rooted for food along the banks of the creek. Rooting Creek is approximately 8 miles long from its headwaters to its tailwaters at Gnatty Creek.

Several of the local men including Columbus McPherson, Nicholas Post and Enoch Post were on the committee that made preparations for the construction of the third Johnstown Church built in 1884. The church is still standing and used every Sunday. The bricks for the church were made in a kiln on the William Lee Post farm about ¼ mile from the church and hauled to the site via horse and wagon.

There were several local carpenters in the area who are known. The Davis Brothers from Salem built several of the houses on Rooting Creek and several in Lost Creek itself. The sons of Worthington Thrash, Judson "Judd" and Laco Green, were also local carpenters. The brothers were both born in the 1880's. Judd ran a store and service station for many years and Laco was a school teacher. The buildings constructed by these carpenters have similar features and decorative elements.

Duck Creek Road from just south of West Milford to its junction with the Clarksburg to Weston turnpike was also surveyed. Duck Creek is the largest tributary on the east side of the West Fork River between Hackers Creek and Lost Creek. It was named by a party of hunters who were camped near the mouth of the creek and saw a wood duck fly down with its young from its nest in a tree beside the creek. Duck Creek empties into the West Fork River about two miles south of West Milford. It is only four miles long but has a fall of 100 feet in that distance.

Duck Creek was settled in the spring of 1792 by Watters Smith and his family who emigrated from New Jersey. The next settler to arrive was John W. Gaston. John M. Davisson and Nathan West came together in 1803 and settled on Duck Creek. Early common names were Smith, Romine, Gaston, Squire, and Davisson. Several of these family names are still represented on Duck Creek.

The areas surveyed remain chiefly rural and agriculture is still a viable industry but the good quality of life and deep roots in the past are the most positive aspects of these settlements.

DESCRIPTION OF THE SURVEY AREA

The areas surveyed within Harrison County are enumerated below. The survey focused on agricultural properties and did not record any resources within a community with the exception of five residences in the small town of Wyatt.

Harrison County is located in the north central portion of West Virginia on the Allegheny Plateau and consists of 418 square miles. The county seat is Clarksburg, located in the center of the county. The West Fork River is the largest river in the county.

The first area surveyed in this project was the Wallace area. It is in the northwest corner of Harrison County. It includes Wallace itself, Middle Run, Big Elk Creek Road, Little Elk Creek Road, Harris Fork, the small towns of Margaret and Dola and portions of State Route 20.

In the north central portion of the county, the area surrounding Wyatt and Peora was surveyed. This includes the towns of Wyatt, Oakdale, and Peora, and farms on Cunningham Run Road, Bingamon Creek Road, Big Indian Run Road, and Little Indian Run Road.

Additional sites in the Romines Mills and Lost Creek area were also surveyed. This area is located in the southeast portion of Harrison County. This includes the small town of Johnstown and Rockford. It also includes Lost Creek Road, Stevens Run Road, Hastings Run Road, Johnstown Road, Raccoon Run Road, Jake Run Road, Rockford Drive, Blue Lick Road, and Rooting Creek Road.

Duck Creek Road from just south of West Milford to its junction with the Clarksburg to Weston turnpike was also surveyed. Duck Creek is the largest tributary on the east side of the West Fork River between Hackers Creek and Lost Creek.

It should also be noted that sites #121, 122 and 123, all located on Rooting Creek, are actually located in Upshur County rather than Harrison County. They were included in this survey because their access is through Harrison County and their histories relate to the small community of Johnstown located in Harrison County. They were also included because they were contiguous with the other sites on Rooting Creek.

It was expected that the survey area would contain primarily late 19th and early 20th century farms and residences in a rural setting. This was not the case. The resources found span the early 18th century to the early 20th century. The older farms and homes were not expected. It was also expected that many of the resources would have been modified to the point of having lost integrity and that modern intrusions would be numerous. While many of the homes were somewhat modified, many still retained most of their character defining elements, plans and materials. All of the farms and homes

were located in rural settings but very few intrusions were noted. This land remains primarily agricultural with large tracts dominating.

The majority of the recorded resources fall within the early 20th century and the buildings are primarily two-story, wood frame houses. There are also many intact secondary farm buildings.

No commercial buildings were recorded as part of this survey but one structure, site #065E, a concrete bridge, was recorded because it is part of the access to a farm. The bridge is concrete and allows access from the hard top to the farm property over a small creek. It was built for the original owner, Davis, by the Luten Bridge Company of York, Pa. in 1918. It is in good condition.

Farms and agricultural buildings were the focus of this survey but five small houses were recorded in the small town of Wyatt. This includes sites #0044-0048. The consultant team felt that a representation of this town's coal mining boom was important considering the decline of the downtown.

It was also expected that the majority of the farm houses would be Vernacular in style with very little ornamentation. This also was not the case. Many of the homes were built with stylistic interpretations and were quite large. Architectural styles include Queen Anne, Four Square, Bungalow, Federal, Folk Victorian, Colonial Revival and Italianate.

The most represented style in the survey is the Folk Victorian style. This includes: The Whetsell House, site #0018, ca. 1900; Meredith House/Hess Farm, site #0035, 1895; Hallpenny/Hardesty House, site #0040, ca. 1880; Hallpenny House, site #0041, ca. 1890; White House, site #0068, ca. 1900; the Runyon House, site #0083, ca. 1889; the Smith House, site #0098, ca. 1890; the Cornwell House/Bishop Farm, site #0103, ca. 1870; Blake House, site #0109, ca. 1885; the Lewis House, site #0113, ca. 1900; site #0114, ca. 1890; the Hiney House, site #0115, ca. 1890; Suan House, site #0116, 1900; the Suan/Post House, site #0117, ca. 1870/1904; Albright House/Gordon Post Farm, site #0121, ca. 1880; Douglas House/McPherson Farm, site #0123, 1899; and the Langbein House, site #0145, ca. 1890.

Some of the oldest houses in the survey area are partial or complete log cabins. These include: the Morris House, site #0063, ca. 1790; Stoller House, site #0064, ca. 1790; Webb House, site #0104, ca. 1800; the Engle/Butcher Cabin, site #0125, 1846; Ward House, site #0126, ca. 1850; Lewis House, site #0107, ca. 1850; and the Thrash Homeplace, site #0124, ca. 1850. The Engle/Butcher Cabin is a pristine example of the log cabin style but it has been moved from its original location and reconstructed. The Stoller House and the Ward House are the best examples of the style and maintain the majority of their original character. The Thrash Homeplace is in very deteriorated condition and the Lewis House has extensive additions. We suspect that several other homes within the survey area contain portions of their original log interiors but the above are all that can be confirmed at present.

There is also one Federal style house in the survey. This is the Martin House, site #0027, ca. 1883. It has been sided with asphalt shingle siding but retains most of its character defining elements.

There are also several Queen Anne style houses. These include: the Sieber House, site #0050, ca. 1900; Tillman House, site #0065, ca. 1912; the Kemmner/Duncan & Maxwell House, site #0130, ca. 1834/1880; and the McWhorter House, site #0150, ca. 1890. The most elaborate example of the Queen Anne style is the Kemmner/Duncan & Maxwell House.

The Italianate style is represented by the following: the Wriston House/Old Arnold & Smith Farm/Pleasant Valley Farm, site #0077, ca. 1860/1890; the Wheeler House, site #0091, ca. 1860; Maxwell House/Enoch Post Farm, site #0118, ca. 1850; Templemoor, site #0132, ca. 1874; and the Hypes House, site #0147, ca. 1860. Templemoor is individually listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is the only brick example of the style in the survey. The Wriston House/Old Arnold & Smith Farm/Pleasant Valley Farm is the most intact example of the Italianate style and has remained in the same family for its entire history. The Hypes House is also a wonderful example of the style but it is deteriorated as is the Maxwell House/Enoch Post Farm.

The Four Square, Colonial Revival and Bungalow styles are also represented and represent a later development of construction in the survey area. The Four Square style includes: the Cunningham House, site #0032, ca. 1915; Weathervane Farm, site #0034, 1933; Miller House, site #0036, 1905; Underwood House, site #0039, ca. 1915; McClutcheon House, site #0045, ca. 1920; the Hickman House, site #0052, ca. 1920; Fetty House, site #0056, 1937; the Winter House, site #0066, ca. 1920; the Terrango House, site #0082, ca. 1940; site #0089, ca. 1920; the Randolph House, site #0101, ca. 1935; and the Bonner House, site #0138, ca. 1920.

The Bungalow style includes: the Campbell House, site #0046, ca. 1930; O'Dell House, site #0047, ca. 1920; Perez House, site #0053, ca. 1930; Shanholtz House, site #0054, 1938; Stuart House, site #0075, ca. 1942; site #0078, ca. 1925; the Nuzem House, site #0097, ca. 1930; Talbott House, site #0105, 1917; Ables House, site #0110, ca. 1930; Jett House/Ruckman Farm, site #0133, ca. 1930; Jett House, 0134, 1928; Nixon House, site #0135, ca. 1930; Straley House, site #0136, ca. 1920; and the Jenkins House, site #0149, ca. 1920.

The Colonial Revival style is represented but it is not numerous in the survey area. This includes: the Shuttleworth House, site #0081, 1950; site #0088, ca. 1920; the Smith House, site #0142, 1930; and the Williams House, site #0143, ca. 1940.

As can be seen by the above list many different styles of architecture are represented in the survey area and they range in dates from the late 1790's up to the 1940's and 1950's. As stated previously, the predominant use of the resources is residential, farm houses and outbuildings. The majority of the resources recorded fall into the early 20th century. A complete list of sites follows.

description: Two-story, rear facing "L" house. Asphalt shingle roof. Vinyl siding. Modern, 1/1 windows. Non-original, one-story, shed roof, entrance porch with turned posts and slatted balustrade on a stone pier foundation. One-story, side gable addition on the left with concrete block foundation. In the rear crook of the el there is a one-story, shed roof, entrance porch with turned posts and a concrete foundation. Stone foundation on the main house. 5 X 4 bays. Original portion of the house is log, ca. 1785. Vernacular style.

description: Two-story, end gable, machine shed that is partially collapsed. Metal roof. Board & batten siding. Stone pier foundation. 3 X 1 bays.

SURVEY ANALYSIS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The initial intent of the project was to determine the extent of agricultural historic resources in the survey area, identify the significant resources and prepare recommendations for additional activities. The potential for National Register eligibility for individual sites or historic districts was also to be investigated. In analyzing the results of the survey, the Criteria of Significance of the National Register of Historic Places was used.

The resources studied under this survey are generally residential in nature and primarily on farms. The resources also include many secondary agricultural buildings such as barns, corn cribs, chicken coops, etc. The resources ranged from the late 18th century to the mid 20th century. It was anticipated that there would be some modifications and some modern intrusions. It was anticipated that the resources found would relate to agriculture and the settlement of the district.

There were some modifications but not as many as anticipated. There were also very few modern intrusions in the areas surveyed. There were some vacant properties but not many. The majority of the resources were historically agricultural and remain agricultural and many of the farms recorded are still owned by the original families. Most of the agricultural area surveyed is still being farmed.

No historic districts are recommended as this was strictly a Reconnaissance Historic Resource Survey and there was a lot of open land and large farms. While many of the resources were found eligible to a historic district, no cohesive historic district exists. Generally, the resources noted as eligible to a historic district are in isolation.

There are several individual sites that warrant further investigation and they may be individually eligible to the National Register of Historic Places. These include:

- The Stoller House, site #0064, ca. 1790. Significant for its association with the settlement and development of the area through its association with the Shaw family and for its association as a stage coach stop.
- The Tillman House, site #0065, ca. 1912. Significant for its association with the development of the area through its association with the Davis family. Also significant for its association with the Queen Anne style of architecture.
- The Wriston House/Old Arnold & Smith Farm/Pleasant Valley Farm, site #0077, ca. 1860/1890. Significant for its association with the settlement and development of the area through its association with the Arnold and Smith families. Also significant for its association with the Italianate style of architecture.

- Site #0088, ca. 1920. Significant for its association with the later development of the area and for its association with the Colonial Revival style of architecture.
- The Kemmner/Duncan & Maxwell House, site #0130, ca. 1834/1880. Significant for its association with the settlement and development of the area through its association with the Duncan and Maxwell families. Also significant as an excellent example of the Queen Anne style of architecture.

Templemoor, site #0132, ca. 1874 is already listed individually on the National Register of Historic Places. It appears to be in good condition and is a wonderful masonry example of the Italianate style of architecture.

There are several geographic areas that warrant further research for a possible National Register Multiple Property Listing for their association with the development of the county through agriculture and farming. These include the Rooting Creek area and the Duck Creek area. There may be additional areas discovered through continued surveying.

The remaining resources do not contain enough architectural or historical integrity to warrant recommending listing in the National Register of Historic Places with the current available information. However, the following list of resources should be further investigated to verify this and to determine their potential for local significance in Harrison County. These sites, while perhaps not eligible under existing National Register criteria, are, in the opinion of the consultant team, significant to the historic and architectural heritage of Harrison County.

The resources recorded in Wyatt would also have local significance for their association with the development of Wyatt and the county in association with the coal mine boom of the early 1900's. These include: sites #0044-0048.

As seen by the list above, there are significant resources associated with the settlement, growth and development of Harrison County, West Virginia.

GENERAL RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended in light of what was recorded in this survey project that the Harrison County HLC continue their efforts to survey the county. It would benefit them to narrow their focus, pick a specific geographic section of the county, perhaps by district, and conduct an intensive Historic Resource Survey of that area. The consultant team believes that there are numerous other significant resources that remain unrecorded.

As the survey area is primarily rural, design review and zoning, etc. is not applicable. In order to identify, document and protect significant resources it is recommended that the HLC establish a County Register.

A County Register works on a local level as the National Register works on a national level. It is simply a development tool and should not be viewed as a hindrance or detriment to personal property rights. It serves to identify and protect significant local resources.

The HLC should be commended for all that they have done to date.
